<b>IMPORTANT DATES</b>		
<b>35<sup>th</sup></b> day after adjournment sine die	June 27, 2011	Ten days' notice of plans to return a bill with objections deadline (see explanation below).
<b>45<sup>th</sup></b> day after adjournment sine die	July 12, 2011	The governor shall have forty-five days, after the adjournment of the legislature sine die, to consider bills presented to the governor less than ten days before such adjournment, or presented after adjournment, and any such bill shall become law on the forty-fifth day unless the governor by proclamation shall have given ten days' notice to the legislature that the governor plans to return such bill with the governor's objections on that day.
